Introduction	The National Conference of Social Workers of Guinea Bissau, held on 23 and
	24 May 2024, at the ENA Conference Hall in Bissau, with the motto "Path, Challenges
	and Prospects". The aim of the event was to organise debates and evaluate the
	professional practice of social workers in Guinea-Bissau.
	The conference was opened by the President of AGAS, Mr Ussumane Embaló, and
	was attended and addressed by representatives of international organisations, namely Ms
	Sónia Polónio, representing UNICEF, Mr Elber Nosolini, National Director of SOS
	Children's Villages, the President of the Organising Committee of the conference, Mr
	Filomeno Teodorico Barbosa, and all the invited institutions were absent.
	During the opening speeches, important considerations were made about the importance
	of the conference. During the two days of the event, three themes were taught, namely
	the Path of Social Work in Guinea-Bissau (facilitated by Dr Maram Mané), Social Work
	and Human Rights (facilitated by Mrs Fernanda da Costa), Social Work and Social
	Policy (taught by Dr Tânia Maria Ramos Godoi Diniz and Sónia Nozadielli,
	respectively) and the Role of Social Workers in Guinea-Bissau (facilitated by Dr Tânia

	Discussing the history of social work in Guinea Bissau, Maram Mané
	highlighted the challenges faced over the years and the prospects for the future of the organisation.

	of professionals who are capable of and committed to promoting social well-being and the
	defence of human rights.
	During his presentation, Maram Mané emphasised the need to strengthen the
	academic training of Social Workers, as well as to promote their valorisation and
	recognition in society. She emphasised the importance of professionals
	keep up to date with new trends and practices in the field, in order to guarantee a
	quality and effective care for the population.
	In short, Mrs Maram Mané's participation and communication were fundamental
	to enrich the debate on Social Work at the conference. His experience and
	knowledge contributed to inspire e motivate the professionals
	present, reaffirming the category's commitment to social transformation and the
	promoting social justice. The active participation of the professionals present demonstrated
	the category's commitment to the improvement of social conditions and the defence of
	human rights in the country. The conference was an important space for reflection and
	collective construction that will certainly contribute to the advancement of the profession and to the
	strengthening social work in Guinea Bissau.
	On the second day of the conference, Mrs Fernanda Maria da Costa spoke,
	the theme of "Social Work and Human Rights", where he shared his
	experience of Brazil during his academic career.
	She highlighted her work in the prison system, emphasising the role of the assistant

as a defender of human rights. Fernanda addressed the challenges faced and prospects for the future. On the other hand, she emphasised the importance of guaranteeing dignity and human rights. Her talk was enriching and inspiring, demonstrating the importance of social workers in the promotion and uncompromising defence of social rights, and highlighting the need for ethical and political commitment in the fight for a fairer and more equal society.

In the same vein, there was online participation by Brazilian professors from the Federal University of São Paulo - Brazil, **Maria Ramos Godoi Diniz and Sónia Nozadielli,** who spoke on the topic of "Social Work and Social Policy". During their presentation, the speakers emphasised the importance of social work throughout history, highlighting linguistic diversity, the politics of good governance, challenges and recommendations for reaffirming the profession.

One of the points discussed was the need to give visibility to social workers in Guinea-Bissau, highlighting their fundamental role in promoting social welfare and defending human rights. Social protection policy strategies were also discussed, emphasising the importance of legislation in each area of intervention. The speakers emphasised the importance of keeping up to date with social policies and engaging in actions that promote equality, equity and social justice.


Recommendations were also put forward to strengthen the work of social workers, such as continuing training, networking and defending the rights of social service users.

In his presentation on the fourth theme, "The Role of Social Work in the Context of Guinea-Bissau's Development", Edilson Mango considered that Guinea-Bissau is far below the development indicators and this reality has contributed to an increase in poverty among the population. In this sense, the speaker defended the importance of social workers working on social issues in order to promote well-being and social justice. For his part, Injai Mané defended the need to implement social policies with a view to improving the lives of the population.
